ABOUT THE AUTHOR & DIRECTOR

Dick Whittington Down Under is the second play written by local playwright Chris Heaton, following on from the success of Pilbara Pan he has once again put an Aussie twist on to a classic English pantomime. Or at least tried his best to as a Pom. A founding member of Pitter Pat Productions with his wife Dani, this is their third show they have put on together and Chris's directing debut. A task that he would never have been able to do with out the guidance and mentoring of his beautiful wife, and no, she didn't make me write that.



BUILDING SETS

The sets are all made by local volunteers predominantly out of recycled and repurposed materials. Painstakingly constructed and painted under carports and on front lawns of members houses these sets have had a harder start to life than most, exposed as they have been to the harsh Pilbara sun and one rather nasty cyclone, they are definitely survivors. For many of the sets this is not their debut, having already been under the stage lights before as part of previous Pitter Pat Productions, Pilbara Pan and Little Shop Of Horrors. We are sure their experience will be imparted to the newer sets in the group and we'll see them return year after year.



MAKING MUSIC

The music in the show is a mixture of original songs and parodies all written and performed by local talent. Some will make you laugh, some will make you cry, one might even make you angry, all will make you hum randomly as they get stuck in your head all night. Be warned you will never be able to listen to the originals again.

Did you know Dick Whittington Down Under was originally scheduled to show in March? Unfortunately the show was cancelled mere days before its planned premier due to the COVID-19 related venue closures. This was unimaginably difficult for all involved but we were overjoyed when in June restrictions lifted, the show was rescheduled and the the cast enthusiastically returned to rehearsal.

"After being so close to showtime back in March when COVID closed the theatre, literally just days before the show – it has been a true testament to those involved to dust themselves off after the bitter disappointment and to come back with renewed vigor, determined to make this an even better show the second time around," said Director Chris Heaton of everyone involved.

THE CREATIVE COLLECTIVE

The Creative Collective is a joint venture between the IF Foundation, City of Karratha & Pitter Pat Productions. This partnership was formed to connect the community to our local theatre (The Red Earth Arts Precinct) and support local skills development in performing arts. The creative collective currenlty runs classes and skills development groups for adults and youth (aged 16+), led by our passionate and experienced facilitators.

Regular classes are held on Friday evenings during school term from 6.00pm to 7.30pm at the Red Earth Arts Precinct. The 'drop in' style allows participants to attend as often or little as suits them.

Suitable for beginners and those with experience, the low cost of these sessions (\$10) makes them an ideal way for community members to try something new, explore their creative side, meet others and of course have fun!

The Creative Collective also curates specialised workshops and Masterclasses with professional performing artists and companies. Occuring several times a year and usually run over a weekend these events allow community members to access professional skill development usually only available in Capital cities. 

ABOUT PITTER PAT PRODUCTIONS

Pitter Pat Productions is a not for profit community theatre company located in Karratha, WA that is focussed on giving local people an outlet to develop new skills and producing shows by and for the wider community.

The company is the brainchild of Danielle Heaton (nee Chamberlain), who developed a passion for and extensive experience in the theatre in her native UK. Since locating to Karratha 6 years ago, Danielle missed these experiences and noticed a lack of community theatre and opportunities for creative expression and performing arts skills development in the Karratha region. Danielle seized the opportunity to create a new theatre group to bring passionate people together, accessible to all community members to experience the joy of participating in all aspects of theatre and performing arts.

Since its inception in 2017 Pitter Pat Productions has continued to blossom and grow, attracting more members and expanding into different projects and service areas. Currently overseen by a committee of talented and dedicated volunteers, the group is focussed not just on shows, but also engaging local people who have an interest in culture and the arts. Together they want Karratha to feel like home and to encourage a sense of belonging in our wonderful community.

In July 2018 Pitter Pat Productions made history by presenting the very first entirely local theatrical production at the REAP. "Pilbara Pan" and in 2019 gave Karratha it's very first Broadway experience with "Little Shop of Horrors". Other highly successful

projects include: "Sing for your Supper" at the Millers Well Community Festival, "Conservatorium of Curiosity" (Haunted House Interactive Experience) at REAF Creep and roving children's entertainment for the Red Earth Arts Festival (REAF). They have also launched the "Creative Collective" (a performance skills development initiative) with the IF Foundation and the City of Karratha.

"Dick Whittington Down Under" is the third major production for the company, written and directed by Chris Heaton, starring local actors and produced by a talented local team this show demonstrates that theatre is truly for everyone. 2021 will bring more exciting opportunities to get involved so watch this space!
